Branscum asked the City Manager to expedite the cover outside the door. Schumpert said Building and Grounds is putting together a package of cost and what needs to be done, it is being pursued.

Mitchell invited the Council and citizens to attend a computer expo at the Great Plains Vo-Tech, Friday from 12:00 p.m. and all day Saturday.

Shanklin said he doesn't think the City Manager should have the thought that they aren't going to sell water to anyone outside the City limits of Lawton, they shouldn't have to move into town to have water.

Schumpert said he received notification from the Finance Director today on their first amount of the LTD tax, they get .45% of the handle and for the first 14 days September the total handle was \$389,000 and the City received \$1,753.75. (Off-track betting at Mike's Sports Grill)

Green thanked Council for approving the lights on 11th Street.
