Meeting Highlights from October 25, 2022

- EXECUTIVE SESSION: Council approved a settlement where Engie Services pay \$875,000 as full settlement of all claims.
- Council adopted resolutions declaring 10 structures in the City of Lawton dilapidated.
- Council approved an agreement with the City of Walters to provide services by the Lawton Animal Welfare.
- Council received a briefing from Municipal Judge, Nathan Johnson on the possibility of becoming a court of record. Council directed staff to put out an RFP to gather information for the outcome of arrests.
