Meeting Highlights from November 8, 2022

- Council approved a resolution amending the City of Lawton FY 22-23 budget by appropriating \$72,900,000.00 to the Lawton Water Authority Fund for wastewater system improvements funded by a Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan.
- Council approved a resolution to designate the original Lawton High School building as “Lawton City Hall”, and designate the Lawton City Council Chambers/Auditorium within Lawton City Hall as “Wayne Gilley Auditorium.”
- Council received a presentation from staff on Fire Rating of #1 and the possibility of a split rating for unprotected areas.
